



A Battleship's Vocabulary

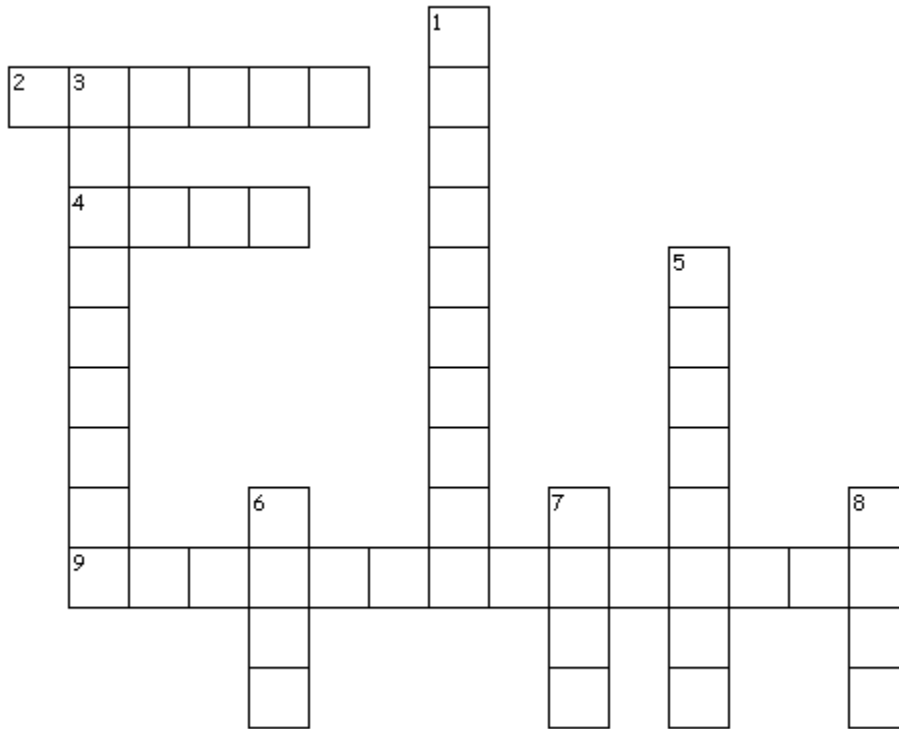
